Horse Safety & Communication

Ears

- Upright Alert//On Guard (Focused toward...)
- Rotating Scanning Environment, Listening to two things at once!
- Backward Looking for signals from behind (rider, other)
- Pinned Back Upset, Irritated, Angry (Get out of way!)

Eyes


- Soft Eyes (Gentle looking) Relaxed, in learning/teaching mode
- Hard Eyes (Tense looking) Anxious, Angry, Resistant (Watch Out!)
- Half- Closed Relaxed, Tired, Sleepy/Sleeping
- Wrinkled: Attentive or Worried Curiosity, Tension, Stress
- Blinking=Thinking Unblinking= Alert, Fearful/Frozen

Horse Signals

- Watch Out!
- On Alert Caution
- Relaxed OK

Muzzle, Lips

- Muzzle Moving Exploring, Grooming, Testing, You hit a good spot!
- Loose, Drooping Relaxed, At Ease, Bored?
- Licking Thinking/Relating, Tension Release
- Chewing Thinking/Relating, Relaxed, Acknowledgment, Stress Release
- Yawning Stress Release
- Tight Mouth Anxiety and Fear
- Wrinkled Annoyance, Disgust
- Biting Air or Object Submission (Young horses Don't hurt me!)
- Nuzzling Bonding, Relaxation, Affection, Looking for treats



Neutral/Level - Focused, Normal

Tail

- Straight Up or Out (High Tailing) Attentive, Excited, Feeling my oats!
- Straight Down Apprehensive, Submissive
- Tucked Tight (Clamped Down) Fearful
- Loosely Curled Calm and Relaxed
- Swishing Annoyed (Insects or other irritant) or Rhythmic swish for balance
- Wringing or Twirling Frustration, Irritation, Aggression (Watch Out!)

- Standing Square Attentive, Ready
- Hind Hoof Resting Relaxed
- Hind Hoof Raised Defensive (Warning!)
- Pawing Foraging, Checking Out, Frustrated, Ready to roll
- Stamping Mild Irritation (Flies?)
- Dancing Around Excited, Nervous, Frightened
- Striking Out Threatening, Angry, Fighting
